- Work closely with other faculty in providing diagnostic support of the diagnostic laboratories (i.e. microbiology, or histopathology and Necropsy, or clinical pathology) which provides service to the Grenada SPCA, SGU Small Animal Clinic, Junior Surgery Laboratory, SGU Large Animal Resource Facility, and local veterinary practitioners.
- Dedication to outstanding service and client communication is highly desired.

Research & Scholarly Activities:

- Actively engage in independent and collaborative research in your area of expertise (Immunopathology) to include projects suitable for veterinary student participation.
- Research areas of emphasis within the PTHB department include immunology, vector borne disease, zoonotic disease and public health, aquatic animal health and parasitology.
- Specific interest and background in collaborative research with SVM faculty in other departments is desirable.
- Develop and contribute to extension and continuing education programs, in collaboration with other departments and/or other schools.

Qualifications:

- Minimum requirements include a DVM or equivalent.

- MSc or PhD or specialty board eligibility for ACZM, ACVP/ECVP or ACVM is preferred.
- Desired qualifications include a record of research scholarship, excellence in didactic lecture and excellent written and interpersonal skills.
