

Assistant/Associate Professor of Microbiology

The Richard A. Gillespie College of Veterinary Medicine at Lincoln Memorial University (LMU-CVM) invites applications for a faculty position in Microbiology. The primary duties of the position include teaching Microbiology and Immunology courses in the DVM curriculum and developing a research program in infectious diseases. Contributing to the service mission of the LMU-CVM including but not limited to serving on committees and contributing to the development of graduate programs.

Candidates must have a DVM or equivalent degree and a PhD. Preferred qualifications include demonstrated substantive scholarly achievement with publications in peer-reviewed journals and board certification by ACVM. The candidate should exhibit outstanding interpersonal skills and a cooperative work ethic that will interact well with all areas of the college.

Lincoln Memorial University is a progressive institution where veterinary medical education innovation is a priority. There are extensive opportunities for independent and collaborative research within the College of Veterinary Medicine and through various external partnerships. Faculty are allowed and encouraged to pursue locum work to maintain their clinical skills. LMU has a vast network of clinical affiliates as part of the distributive clinical year for networking.

Distribution of full-time equivalent (FTE) effort will be determined in accordance with the college's needs, academic priorities, and the candidate's academic goals and expertise and will include a significant teaching and research appointment (40% each). Rank, title, and salary, will be commensurate with academic credentials and experience.

Located in the historical Cumberland Gap, Lincoln Memorial University is a service-driven non-profit university that serves to advance the people of Appalachia. The College of Veterinary Medicine was accredited in 2019 as the 30th veterinary college in the U.S. The LMU-CVM is a distributive program where students spend their first three pre-clinical years in Harrogate, Tennessee and their clinical year is distributed throughout the country at private practices.
